# Which individual demographic characteristics may help to reach 100 ? 

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## The demographic traits are...

- Age
- Sex
- Marital status
- Living arrangements


## Living arrangements : with whom people are living as co-residents

- Living with spouse
- Living with others but not with spouse
- Living alone
- Living in nursing home or other residential facilities for oldest olds
- Living in religious community (monks and nuns)

## Conclusions

Most centenarians lived a signifcant period of their long life alone, especially in old ages, and more women compared to man.

Half of female centenarians lived in nursing home when reaching age 100 but only one third of male centenarians.

Nevertheless both entered in care facilities very late, at 98 years in average So they did not stay so long in this living arrangement and some even enter after the age of 100 .

## ... and recommendations

For men, living with a spouse as long as possible, and, if widowed, remarrying with a younger wife favors longevity.

For women, staying single and living alone, or loosing a husband very early and thereafter living alone seems beneficial for living longer.

But still the most profitable is to join a religious community.
